### 50. CODE OF CONDUCT

Members were reminded of their individual responsibility under the Code of Conduct in respect of making declarations of interest and that any declarations should be made now.

Cllr Andrews declared an interest in agenda item 9 as Chairman of the Ryedale District Council Planning Committee.

Cllr Brampton reported that the Malton & Norton Area Partnership Annual General Meeting will be held on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2021, 2.15pm at The Milton Room.

### 51. PUBLIC ACCESS

Cllr Andrews informed Members of the sad news that District Councillor John Clark had sadly passed away and that the funeral would be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> September at Scarborough Crematoriun.

Cllr Burr reported as the County and District Councillor "a new working group has been set up by NYCC, to discuss the re organisation details. NYCC won the bid, so we will have a very large authority. At the moment it is looking like we will have 90 NYCC Councillors in total, and the group is trying to get similar numbers of residents allocated to each Cllr. Covid figures for Ryedale are currently the highest in North Yorkshire, which is a concern.

I am a member of the new Malton Livestock Centre Working group, which has met twice and is making swift progress to try to re locate the livestock market from Malton town centre.

I attended the first meeting as the newly elected RDC member for the police, fire and crime panel and feel it is an advantage to have a Malton Cllr at these meetings to be able to talk direct to the fire chief and newly elected police commissioner and bring up local issues. At the meeting I ensured Malton's concerns were raised, fellow Cllrs don't hesitate to contact me if you would like me to put direct questions to the police commissioner."

## 52. MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Cllr K Ennis, Mayor of Malton reported "A very brief report as I was away for the most part.

Before I start, I would like to offer our support to Cllr Joan Lawrence with the news of further investigations into the disappearance of Claudia and our thoughts are with you.

It is very disappointing to see the number of Covid cases rising in Ryedale so that we now have the highest rates in North Yorkshire from having at one point one of the lowest rates in the country.

I just hope with the Food Festival on for three days this coming bank holiday weekend and no doubt visitors from far and wide, that we do not see a further spike in the coming weeks.

That being said, with a good weather forecast it will be good to see people out and about hopefully having a good time and enjoying themselves after so long.

The clerk, deputy clerk and I did an inspection of the cemetery at the end of last month and noted areas in older side that are a little overgrown and could do with some care and attention so Mike Todd, Cemetery Manager will be tasked to do that over the next few months.

I mentioned last month that the clerk, deputy mayor and myself walked around around the Peasey Hills area of Malton and noted a list of improvements that could be done in regards to weeding and painting of railings outside the schools and the hand rail on Bevins Hill, The clerk subsequently sought permission to paint the school railings which was granted yesterday and this will be done by Shaun once his time is no longer taken up by watering and caring for the planters. This will give a much needed boost to the appearance of the area which I think is important particularly outside of the two schools.

The Milton Rooms held its first, and I believe the towns first proper Yorkshire Day event. I attended in my capacity as Mayor and then ran the flat cap throwing competition which good fun and was probably the game most subscribed to. Overall the event was well attended and the feed back was extremely good, so next year we hope to build on the success and make the event even bigger and better. A thank you to those Councillors who took the time to attend.

Although I have sent in a written report as the MTC representative for the Milton Rooms. I would just like to say again how delighted the board of trustees are that finally RDC awarded the grant of £500k for the refurbishment of the interior. For me it still doesn't excuse their lack of duty of care to the building as leaseholders and landlords, and the outside still needs maintenance and cleaning to bring it up to the standard it should be as one of the flagship buildings in the market place.

However, the funding will be a turning point for this much neglected community building, and the improvements not only in the much maligned toilets but in the sound and light infrastructure will give it a new lease of life not only for performances and events but we also be able to offer training for local students on the tech side, as we will have one of the most up to date sound systems and lighting rigs in the country. We have already started exploring this option with local schools who have all expressed interest.

At the risk of repeating myself, gratitude does go out to the Councillors who proposed the extra funding and championed the venue and to all the former volunteers and trustees who have worked tirelessly over the years to keep the venue afloat.

I do believe that with the Wesley Centre and the Milton Rooms along with FWE who are now actively trying to do the same, we have a fantastic opportunity to promote Malton not only as a food place but as a centre for arts, performance and events with all the bonus of a knock on effect for local businesses.

Finally, the clerk received an email today from Jill Baldwin the Town Centre Officer of Driffield saying she would like to bring the Mayor and Clerk along with herself to look around Malton, as they are using Malton as a town of "best practice" which is not only a lovely compliment but a great accolade too."

### (b) NEW MALTON CEMETERY WORKSHOP

The building is now complete and the Cemetery Manager has successfully moved his welfare, tools and machinery into the building.

## (c) <u>CEMETERY IMPROVEMENTS</u>

The additional work to include conduit being fitted to the internal gable end ceilings to prevent debris from the roof entering the chapels is now complete but requires painting, it is anticipated that this work will be carried out week commencing 30<sup>th</sup> September to complete the project.

The shipping container has now been removed and the road re-surfacing work will be carried out week commencing 13th September.

An open afternoon to showcase the newly restored chapels will be held on **Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2021 from 1pm – 4pm.** Letters will go out to all stake holders and groups closely associated with the industry inviting them to view the chapels with refreshments available.

### (d) MALTON IN BLOOM

One of the newly planted trees at the bottom of Castlegate was stolen on the evening of Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> August and thrown over County Bridge. The incident was reported to North Yorkshire Police on Sunday morning but unfortunately they have not yet identified the perpetrator. North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue crew officers at Malton kindly rescued the tree and replanted it back in position.

A grant for £1,000 has been obtained for the Broughton Rise Sensory Garden from NYCC Stronger Communities, the Clerk is awaiting for the outcome of two further grant applications to enable Malton In Bloom to start the project.

## (e) ORCHARD FIELDS INTERPRETATION BOARDS

The Clerk is working with Michael Gwilliam to obtain grant aid and financial contributions to purchase five new interpretation boards to be installed at Orchard Fields.

One board would be installed at each of the two main entrances to give the site context and details of useful contacts. The remaining three boards will be located around the site and tell the story of the fort and settlement with accompanying illustrations and photographs.

The boards will include all the latest archaeological evidence and particularly the evolution of the settlements up to the present day. A local graphic artist will provide an attractive display on the boards and a local firm will construct the boards and their supporting structure. Installation will be carried out by local volunteers under close supervision to keep costs down. It is intended that that the boards would be completed during this winter with installation in spring 2022. The necessary permissions have been obtained from Malton Fitzwilliam Estate.
