81. <u>CODE OF CONDUCT</u>

Members were reminded of their individual responsibility under the Code of Conduct in respect of making declarations of interest and that any declarations should be made now.

82. MAYOR'S REPORT

"On 2nd October, although not formally invited, I informally attended an event to celebrate the Half Pipe Restoration at Norton Skate Park, which attracted skaters from across the country, joining Norton Mayor Di Keal. We were both invited to be pictured with various prize winners at the end, and it was a joyous occasion, with refreshments, a band, and people of all ages enjoying the brand new installed Skatelite surface. Our Tim was there and arranged St John's Ambulance cover and tidying up.

On 3rd October I drew the Racing Welfare Raffle at their office in Old Maltongate. On 4th October I attended the YLCA (Yorkshire Local Council Association) Ryedale branch meeting. Concern has been expressed that the current Police Fire and Crime Commissioner does not follow previous office holders practice of attending in person meetings to meet parish councillors, opting instead for County wide ZOOM meetings twice a year, though her second one scheduled for November has been cancelled I understand without explanation.

On Wednesday 5th October I chaired a Joint informal meeting of the Town Councils with Cllr Keane Duncan and Highways Officers. I have submitted comments to the clerk for the relevant part of tonight's meeting concerning this so won't repeat them here, save to say how grateful I am, and am sure we all are, to Cllr Burr and our Clerk, and Cllr Hawes, for coming to the rescue when a Norton member became unwell, and their swift response to get him to hospital and stay with him as long as needed.

I am pleased to support a Mayor's concert jointly in aid of Racing Welfare and Ryedale Foodbank, at St Michael's Church. Charity Brass, of which our deputy clerk is a member, are giving their services for free. I hope councillors may be able to attend or otherwise support this event: Racing Welfare had a major fundraiser (Open Stables) cancelled because of the mourning period following the death of the Queen, and Ryedale Foodbank is feeling the pressure with hugely increased demand and falling donations of food. Tickets are on sale at just $\pounds 5$, there will also be refreshments and raffle being organised by Racing Welfare staff. The concert is on Saturday 26th November at 7pm with possibly some early festive music included. Flyers and publicity will be available shortly.

As I write, I am on the way to represent the 20s Plenty for North Yorkshire campaign, with a presentation at the 20s Plenty National Conference on Thursday the 20th October, and sorry to be unable to be at the meeting tonight.

I have personally found the last week very challenging following adverse publicity in last week's Gazette about a council decision. I am disappointed that questions about the integrity of councillors, be they "independent" or standing openly as a political party, have been aired in the front pages of the local newspaper, rather than focussing on the issues, or accepting the decisions of councillors that are following through on a clear platform in elections. I hope we as a council can move forward now and progress the Neighbourhood Plan, and if necessary appoint any necessary replacements to the committee. I will be extending my thanks to resigning members in due course for their service".

84. COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Cllr Andrews gave a verbal update on his role as a District Councillor. Work is ongoing with Ryedale District Council to potentially sell Wentworth street car park to Fitzwilliam Malton Estate which has now been referred to Policy & Resources Committee. Ryedale District Council have approximately three million pounds of CIL funding for Ryedale, concerns have been raised as NYCC Leaders are trying to stop these funds being spent and to be transferred over to the new authority not ring fenced for Ryedale. Cllr Andrews amongst other District Members is challenging this decision.

Cllr Andrews also gave an update on the progress of the Local Plan review and issues around the local occupancy clause.

Cllr Burr gave a brief update on the progress local government review and the re-naming of County Bridge.
