187. CODE OF CONDUCT

Members were reminded of their responsibility under the Code of Conduct in respect of making declarations of interest and that any declarations should be made now.

188. MAYOR'S REPORT

"On 3rd March I attended the National Association of Local Councils Annual Conference on "Standards Matter", where it was discussed whether and what sort of regulation might assist better standards in Tier 1 authorities such as town and parish councils. It was generally agreed that some sort of mandatory training for both clerks and councillors would help raise standards, together with better legal guidelines, assistance and ultimately sanctions if necessary when standards fall below what is reasonable to expect.

On 6th April, I watched an outstanding performance of "The Addams Family" at the Milton Rooms, given by Ryedale Youth Theatre. There was no weak link, with both lead and supporting talking/singing roles, and all the dancing, being of the highest standard that would do a West End Show proud. The young people, directors, band, lighting, stage managers, front of house, and everyone involved in Ryedale Youth Theatre have excelled themselves. Funny, moving, a whole range of emotions and expression were delightfully capturing both the nuance and exuberance needed to carry this musical off.

A huge amount of work of our young people is to be commended. I also noticed how well the recent refurbishment of the Milton Rooms has paid off, with much better toilet facilities, furniture, and decoration, amongst other improvements: the whole place is looking very smart and a venue that Malton that can be proud of. I am pleased that Malton Town Council is supporting this venue with a £3,000 grant this financial year, but the venue could not function without thousands of hours of volunteer time, and I would encourage more residents to get involved if able.

I also was invited to a viewing of the unique Iron Age shield on the same day at Malton Museum. It was found in a chariot burial in Pocklington, 2,400 years old, it is an impressive example of Celtic art and metalwork, and was found with the skeleton of a c. 46 year old man buried on top. Cllr Burr attended the Scrutiny Health Committee which have been tasked with holding the hospital chiefs to account with regard to ambulance response times and A&E waiting times (stroke patients to be a priority) whilst supporting our nurses and doctors. This is a cross party committee and very interesting.

Cllr Burr and other previous Ryedale Members are working hard to pursue and advance the payment of the CIL decision that was made by RDC, ensuring that the three million allocation is paid out from the Ryedale funds to the successful applicants, including Malton Town Council, Malton School and Kirkham Henry. Cllr Burr is also supporting the application of The Wesley Centre.

Following an accident involving a large vehicle reversing into the wall in Wentworth Street Car Park, damaging the wall and two headstones, the headstones have now been repaired by Dales of Thirsk. This was part of an insurance claim by Ryedale District Council.



(f) MAINTENANCE CONTRACT UPDATE

Contractors Chris and Sam have repaired the bus shelter on Highfield Road, installed the new mushrooms and path at the Broughton Rise site, painted the wood planters on the roundabouts and added gravel to the seating area on Castlegate













(g) ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Unfortunately the town has suffered from some serious anti-social behaviour recently. The ears on the sheep sculpture have been snapped off, Malton In Bloom planters and trees have been damaged at the junction to The Mount/Middlecave Road, the New Malton Cemetery shed and greenhouse has also been damaged. All incidents have been reported to North Yorkshire Police and on the MAPS virtual fortnightly meeting. Three individuals have been identified and NYP are dealing with them.
